Presidential Proclamation -- Honoring The Victims Of The Attack In San Bernardino, California

HONORING THE VICTIMS OF THE ATTACK IN SAN BERNARDINO, CALIFORNIA

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

A PROCLAMATION

As a mark of respect for the victims of gun violence perpetrated on December 2, 2015, in San Bernardino, California, by the authority vested in me as President of the United States by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, I hereby order that the flag of the United States shall be flown at half-staff at the White House and upon all public buildings and grounds, at all military posts and naval stations, and on all naval vessels of the Federal Government in the District of Columbia and throughout the United States and its Territories and possessions through December 7, 2015. I also direct that the flag shall be flown at half-staff for the same length of time at all United States embassies, legations, consular offices, and other facilities abroad, including all military facilities and naval vessels and stations.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand this third day of December, in the year of our Lord two thousand fifteen, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and fortieth.





Local roundup: MPC women win first of season

Daniela Villegas scored 16 points Thursday night in Monterey Peninsula College's 67-41 win over L.A. Pierce in the Cuesta College women's basketball tournament.

Lillian Dawkins added 12 points for MPC, while Monae Hobson finished with 11.

The victory was the first of the year for the Lobos, who opened the season with four straight defeats.

Men's basketball preview: MPC sophomores stepping up their games

No one felt the harsh transition from high school to college basketball more last year than Chris Evans and Kyle Hieb at Monterey Peninsula College.

The pair struggled for playing time while adjusting to the speed and physicality of the game.

While their confidence may have been shaken from the lack of playing time, it also pushed them to enhance their games by working on their weaknesses, including the mental aspect.

No longer overwhelmed, the game has slowed down for the two Seaside High graduates and former members of The Herald's All-County team.

Evans, The Herald's Basketball Player of the Year in 2013, was averaging 8.5 points a game off the bench through MPC's first five games this year, up from 1.8 last year.

Hieb, whose scoring average is up nearly six points a game, gives the Lobos a sharpshooter on the outside, forcing teams to come out and defend beyond the 3-point arc.

If there was one person who didn't seem fazed from the transition last year, it was Isaac Clark, who dropped in 14.9 points a game for the Lobos.

While Clark has been nursing a sore ankle in the preseason, when he's on the court, he is an impact player, averaging nearly 17 points a game.

As a team, MPC is averaging nearly five points a game more this year, despite not having Clark for two games.

Sophomore Deondre Otis has elevated his game this season, dropping in 16 points a game, more than double his average from last season.

So too has Jazz Bajwa, who has gone from 3.2 points a game to 12 points this season. A former three-time all-leaguer at Irvington High in Fremont, the guard is a highlight reel when dunking.

With no true center listed on the roster, MPC is going to run a three-guard, two-forward offense that will get up and down the court.

A concern for the Lobos in the preseason was finishing games. The Lobos blew halftime leads in two of their first three losses.

Local roundup: MPC men beat Hartnell in West Valley Tournament

A near triple-double from Deondre Otis on Friday lifted the Monterey Peninsula College men's basketball team to a dramatic 77-71 overtime win over rival Hartnell in the West Valley Tournament in Saratoga.

Otis finished with a team-high 20 points, 11 rebounds and seven assists for the Lobos, who have won five in a row and are 9-5 overall.

Isaac Clark added 13 points and seven rebounds for MPC. Former Seaside High standout Kyle Hieb tallied 12 points and six boards, while Isaiah Brown had 11 points and six rebounds.

Hartnell, which has already surpassed last year's entire win total, fell to 7-4.
