## EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT TO MPC GOVERNING BOARD OF TRUSTEES January 27, 2015

*Monterey Peninsula College Foundation supports MPC by being a strong advocate for the College in the community and by raising significant financial support for the College.*

### **FUNDRAISING**

1. **Total Monthly Donations Received in December 2015:** To be Announced.
2. **President's Circle Campaign**  
The 2015 President's Circle Campaign raised a record-breaking \$266,643, reaching 106% of our goal (\$250,000). Funding from this campaign provides vital resources for the Foundation, allowing us to support a variety of campus and student assistance programs.
3. **Business Partnership Program**  
In 2015, we launched a business/corporate sponsorship program that encourages local, regional, and national businesses to invest in MPC. We will be expanding this program in 2016 and look forward to welcoming new business partners as they come on board.
4. **Grants**  
New grant awards for 2015 totaled \$186,759 – while total grant dollars received in 2015 exceeded \$318,000.
5. **Food for Thought**  
The MPC Foundation received over \$5,616 in donations through the Monterey County Weekly Gives! Campaign, which will be matched by the program. This year our project, *Food for Thought*, involves provide food cards to financially needy students to be able to purchase meals at the cafeteria.

Professional Development

Funded by Student Success and Student Equity, Student Services classified staff participated in an On Course Workshop titled, *Front Line Staff Workshop: Creating a Culture of Success*. The Front Line Staff Workshop is a learner-centered professional development event designed to provide participants with principles and practices for empowering students to achieve greater academic success and persistence. The workshop is designed to address the unique interaction between front line staff and students as an opportunity to enhance student responsibility and ultimate success in the college experience.

Outreach

Student Services (EOPS) hosted Learning for Life Charter High School in Marina. Students participated in a campus tour of MPC as well as an informational session on MPC programs and services.

The Student Success and Support Program (3SP) proctored the MPC math assessment for juniors at Seaside High School. The purpose of this early assessment is to provide the students and the school an additional tool for discussion around the importance of math and math placement during the students' senior year.

CalWORKs

MPC has secured \$97,891 from the Monterey County Department of Social Services CalWORKs Employment Services to provide expanded on-campus work study opportunities for CalWORKs participants. The goal is to enhance employment skills of CalWORKs attending MPC.
