Monterey Peninsula College uses the Test of Essential Academic Skills (ATI TEAS). The <u>minimum adjusted individual score required</u> for admission is 62%. Assessment/readiness test results: ATI TEAS #1 of 1 taken at MPC OR first passing ATI TEAS result (62 or greater) taken elsewhere (will not accept re-takes taken within one calendar year of a previous test unless the version has changed, OR First re-take following completion of the remediation plan approved by MCCSN Director. Score: O 85 – 100 (30 points) O 75.0 – 84.9 (20 points) O 62.0 – 74.9 (10) < 62.0 – Disqualified (Need to remediate and Re-apply). If selected, you will be asked to provide <u>official</u> results by going to www.atitesting.com online store and requesting your official ATI TEAS results be sent to MPC. There is a fee for this service. If ATI TEAS taken at MPC — Applicants do not need to submit any documentation; your results will be accessible online and added to your application.	All applicants will be scored in two phases: First using all of the point categories <u>except</u> ATI TEAS (max of 70 points possible), and then again adding in the ATI TEAS scores (max of 100 points possible after ATI TEAS score added). First time TEAS testing and first remedial re-take will be available at MPC for 60 students selected in Phase 1 from the top 40% of applicant scores. These top 40% of applicants will then be re-ranked by adding the points assigned for their TEAS is not required in order to submit your application. However, if you have completed TEAS on your own prior to application, you can anticipate the number of points that correspond to your score and include in your projected total score below. ONLY TEAS #1 of 1, or the first passing score (62 or greater) will be counted toward the score. Re-takes will not be considered unless at least one year has elapsed since the previous test, OR the re-take is approved by the Director, School of Nursing after completion of a remediation plan.		
TOTAL SCORE (Maximum Possible Points 100)			The top 40% of the Phase 2 subgroup <b>will be selected for admission</b> , along with enough Phase 2 TEAS passers randomly selected from the last score group to fill the class. The remainder of TEAS passers will be alternates for the immediately following fall enrollment only. Those students who are not admitted must re-apply the following year.
