Scotty Thomason, Team Chair President College of the Siskiyous

Previously, he has served as Institutional Program Review and Outcomes Coordinator, Academic Senate President, and chair or co-chair of multiple college-wide committees. He has also served a CTE program director, department chair, and presiding chair of Southwestern's council of department chairs. He is active in the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges; he chaired the Accreditation and Assessment Committee in 2015-2016, and chairs the ASCCC Equity and Diversity Action Committee in 2016-2017. He has been a member of his College's Accreditation Oversight Committee (AOC) since 2010, has been involved in writing two self-studies. This is his second team visit.



Dr. Sandra Caldwell *President Reedley College*

Dr. Caldwell was selected as Reedley College president in 2013. Prior to her time at Reedley College, Dr. Caldwell served for eight years at Western Wyoming Community College, most recently as Associate Vice President for Planning and Improvement. She has also held administrative leadership and faculty roles at Paris Junior College in Paris, Texas and Oklahoma State University. Dr. Caldwell holds a B.S. in mathematics education and M.S. in statistics from Oklahoma State University, and a Ph.D. in supervision, curriculum, and instruction in higher education with emphasis in community colleges from Texas A&M University-Commerce. She is active at the state and national level, serving on the Rural Community College Alliance, CCLC's Legislative Advisory Council, Linked Learning Alliance, Council of Presidents

and Chancellors, Central Valley Higher Education Consortium, and the State Chancellor's Accreditation Workgroup II.



Dr. Barbara Dunsheath *History Professor East Los Angeles Community College*

Dr. Dunsheath is a tenured History Professor at East Los Angeles Community College.
