That the Governing Board receives the Student Success and Achievement Report, "Scorecard Completion Outcome: Five-Year Trends."

Background:

In its commitment to increase transfer and degree and certificate attainment, the California Community Colleges Board of Governors established the Student Success Scorecard (scorecard.cccco.edu), a performance measurement system that tracks student success at all California community colleges. The data available in this scorecard illustrate how well colleges are doing in remedial instruction, job training programs, retention of students, and graduation and completion rates.

At the October 12, 2016 Special Board meeting, the Board will receive a report on Monterey Peninsula College's Scorecard completion outcome. The report will be presented by Dr. Rosaleen Ryan, Director of Institutional Research.
