EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT TO MPC GOVERNING BOARD OF TRUSTEES March 22, 2017

FUNDRAISING

1. **Total Funds Received in February 2017:** To be shared at the Board meeting.
2. **Grants:** Recently submitted grants include: two proposals to the Chapman Foundation (one for Upward Bound and one for the Evans College Incentive Program) and two to the Pebble Beach Company Foundation (one for the Evans College Incentive Program and the other for the CDC Outdoor Learning Classroom).

Proposals under development that are due this Spring: Title V Hispanic Serving Institutions Grant (due April 21), which will be a cooperative grant with CSUMB, and a Chevron grant to support MPC's STEM programs.

COLLEGE SUPPORT

1. **Evans College Incentive Program Nominations**
The Foundation has received over 100 nominations from various local high schools for students to participate in the third cohort of our College Incentive program. The program is doing well and continues to evolve and improve. For example, upon Student Services' recommendation, this year eligible nominees will be strongly encouraged to attend Join the Pack day and/or a High School assessment event prior to the end of their senior year. This will allow them to be better prepared to start at MPC in the Fall.
2. **Faculty & Staff Advancement Awards (FASA) Spring 2017 Cycle**
The Spring FASA cycle closed on February 19, 2017. We received 18 proposals requesting \$50,798.25 collectively. The FASA Advisory Group met March 8 and will bring recommendations to the Board of Directors on March 15 to fund 17 proposals for a total of \$19,183.40.
3. **National Council for Marketing & Public Relations (NCMPR) Conference**
Beccie Michael will attend the NCMPR National conference from March 26-30 on behalf of MPC. NCMPR is the leading professional organization for community college marketing and PR issues.
