# **Academic Affairs Report**Presented by Kiran Kamath, VPAA

### 1. Enrollment Update:

To grow our enrollment in Spring 2017, we have added 50 late start class sections beginning the week of March 27, after Spring Break. If we can achieve an average class size of 35 students, we could add another 120-150 FTES to the current projection of 2840 FTES in spring 2017. We are targeting 3000 FTES this spring, with a productivity goal of 14.0.

(Note: We have two enrollment goals: (1) to **increase enrollments** in order to increase apportionment revenue while (2) **improving productivity** to keep the cost of generating FTES in line with the state funding formula.)

#### 2. Accreditation Response to Recommendation:

#### Addressing course-level SLO assessment:

We currently have 1378 active courses and have assessed 724 courses or 52.5% since fall 2013. The goal is to assess 100% of our courses by December 2017 and include this in our Accreditation Response due to ACCJC on March 15, 2018.

The college has adopted a two-year cycle of course assessment, so 25% of our courses will be assessed each semester. The 2017-18 Catalog will not include courses currently being archived. Effective the 2018-19 catalog year, only assessed courses will be scheduled.

The Division Chairs, faculty, Deans as well as the Curriculum Advisory Committee are working hard to streamline the number of active courses at MPC in order the make the number of courses assessed within the two year cycle more manageable.

At the February 15, 2017 meeting of AAAG, it adopted the following guideline: If a course has not been offered in the last two years, and if it is not being scheduled and offered within the next academic year, it should be archived in CurricUNET and deleted in the Chancellor's Office.

#### Addressing program-level assessment:

We currently have 160 programs. MPC has adopted a 4-year assessment cycle for programs, so 40 programs will be assessed each year.

The Title 5 (55000g) definition of program is, "an organized sequence of courses leading to a defined objective, a degree, a certificate, a diploma, a license, or transfer to another institution of higher education". It includes all degrees, certificates of achievement, certificates of completion, and certificates of training issued by MPC.

The Learning Assessment Committee is working with the Academic Senate, AAAG, and the Divisions to gather information and assist the campus with building capacity for PLO (Program Learning Outcome) assessment.
