Athletics

Herman Edwards was inducted to the CCCAA Hall of Fame on Wednesday March 29 for his NFL football and coaching career and wonderful community service. This is the highest honor a community college athlete can receive in the state of California. MPC's other members are Mel Mason and Chris Pappas. Walt may talk about this as he attended the dinner.

The MPC softball team is currently in second place in their division and fighting for a play-off spot.

MPC track athletes Breann Scally and Tenisha Hill have qualified for the Norther California Heptathlon Championships in Santa Rosa. A bid to the state championships is probable. The Lobos currently have 33 athletes competing which is the largest number in years. This is a result of new full-time head coach Marcus Carroll's recruiting efforts. MPC will host the Coast Conference track championships on April 29.

Coach Carroll also coordinated hosting a 15 team high school meet on Thursday March 16. This was the first high school meet in the stadium. Close to 400 local athletes competed including 80 from Gonzales High School. This was a tremendous outreach event and we hope to hold more meets in the future.

Our women's tennis coach, Vi Tran, was selected "Coach of the Year" for a second straight year.

Child Development Center

The California Community College Early Childhood Education Regional (ECE Faculty group through the Chancellor's Office) meeting was hosted by MPC at the ECE Lab School on Friday, March 31, 2017. Six community colleges were represented.

The ECE Lab School/CDC was assessed for the QRIS current grant. Findings should be provided by the end of May 2017.

Student Success & Equity, Career Transfer Center Outreach Activities

1. High School Assessments: We conducted assessments for graduating high school seniors at their high school campus for Carmel, Carmel Valley, Marina, Monterey, and Seaside high schools. We will be testing at Central Coast High later this week. We held an assessment event for graduating high school seniors at the MPC campus on April 8. **We will have assessed a combined total of 404 graduating seniors** once the session at Central Coast High is completed.
2. HBCU Tour - During Spring Break we took a group of 10 students to a tour of HBCU campuses in Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, and Georgia. Several of the students received on site admission to one or more of the nine campuses that were visited.
3. Expanding Equity Discussion Series - hosted Veronica Neal for a presentation for students, staff, and faculty on cultural humility as a path to equity.
4. AB 288 - presented our CCAP agreements to the PGUSD and MPUSD Boards. Added a new pathway, Theatre Arts, at Monterey High. Working on developing a "Sports Medicine" pathway at Carmel High.
5. Now that the Board has approved the hire, we'll have our CSC at the Marina position begin working tomorrow.
6. ACE - dual admissions. Nicole may have this in her update but, just in case, we've put up the new webpage for the ACE program and CSUMB has begun reaching out to students to share the opportunity. In the early stages of the hiring process for the CSC II - Dual Enrollment Coordinator position.
7. Outreach - continued outreach to the high schools. Curtis visits our service area high schools twice a week and the Salinas area schools once a week.
8. Join the Pack! Day - April 29th from 10 am - 2 pm. holding Schedule Building Workshops for graduating high school seniors. They'll develop their fall schedules, meet with a counselor, and leave registered for fall. Offering English, Math, and ENSL

assessments. Conducting campus tours, MPC and financial aid application workshops, musical entertainment, activities for kids, food, a student panel focused on how parents and families can help support students and their success, a workshop on becoming an MPC student (including courses/degree/certificate programs), a set of workshops for parents (My Student is in College! Now What? and a general information session for parents that covers the services available to students and FERPA), and MPC program information tables.

9. Evans - working with the foundation to identify the next group of Evans Scholars and to get them connected to MPC and our support resources.
10. Assessments - began our Summer/Fall testing period in March and are working to implement system so that we can identify students who are eligible for the English Department's Acceleration Pilot project.
 - Will continue to offer English and Math assessments on the Monterey campus 3 times a week, monthly at the Marina Center, and ENSL assessments monthly on both the Monterey and the Marina campuses.
11. CTRC Sponsored Workshops
 - How to Choose a Major Workshop - CTRC and Counseling partnering to conduct workshops twice a month in March and April.
 - Resume Writing - CTRC and COOP partnering to conduct two workshops in April as a lead up to the Career & Job Fair
12. Continued visits from 4 year college representatives - CSUMB, FIDM, Art Institute of CA, Grand Canyon University, UCSC - sponsored through the CTRC
13. College Visit - CTRC will sponsor a trip to San Jose State on the 21st.
14. Career & Job Fair - partnering with the Job Center to plan the Career & Job Fair on April 19 from 10 am - 1 pm
15. MPC Application Workshops - conducted a series of 7 application workshops for graduating high school seniors in March and one in April to help graduating high school seniors with applying for admission to MPC.
16. CTRC Information Table - CTRC continued to have an information table in the LTC for students interested in transferring (twice in March and once in April).

Veterans

The Veterans are participating and/or hosting in the following events:

April 12th, Disabled American Veterans feed: the veterans' club host a dinner feed two times (fall and spring semester) a year to the board members of the DAV.

April 13th, Boots to Books Workshop: this is our last workshop for the semester. The theme "Town Hall Meeting" is where veterans can come to express their concerns regarding their struggles with school and/or personal challenges and provide them with resources.

April 17th, Mini Stand Down: I will be participating in the mini stand down event at the Veterans Transition Center in Marina that is targeted to female veterans only.
