
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What is
Student Equity?





Success Indicators



Access

Comparing the percentage of each population group that is enrolled at the college to the adult population within our service area.



Course Completion

The ratio of the number of credit courses that students complete compared to their enrollment numbers at census.



Basic Skills & ENSL Completion

The number of students who complete a degree applicable course after having completed the final ENSL or basic skills course compared to the number of students who completed that final ENSL or basic skills course.



Degree/Certificate Completion

The ratio of the number of students who obtain a certificate or degree compared to the number of students who identified that as a goal.



Transfer

The ratio of the number of students who complete a minimum of 12 units and have attempted a transfer level math or English course compared to the number who actually transfer after 1-6 years.



Identify Gaps

Disaggregate data for various populations groups to determine if there are any gaps in achievement.

Set Goals

Identify specific goals and outcomes to address the disparities that are discovered upon review of the data.

Implement Activities

Develop and implement activities and interventions that are designed to target identified goals and close these gaps.



Mandated Populations

Population groups for which we are required to disaggregate data and identify any possible disproportionate impacts.





Student Success Committee

Committee membership includes representatives assigned by Academic Senate, MPCEA, and ASMPC. Other members are individuals who are assigned to the committee based upon their role at the college and their instruction or support services are provided to targeted population groups.





Literature Points to Six Success Factors

- •Directed: Students have a goal and know how to achieve it

- •Valued: Students' skills, talents, abilities and experiences are recognized; they have opportunities to contribute on campus and feel their contributions are appreciated













