FUNDRAISING

1. **Total Funds Received in June 2017:** To be reported at Board meeting.
2. **Grants:** Proposals currently under development: Dunspaugh-Dalton Foundation, Bank of America, Honda Foundation, Community Foundation for Monterey County (CFMCO). Pending proposals: Title V Hispanic Serving Institutions Grant, a cooperative grant with CSUMB, requesting \$3.75 million over five years.

CSUMB has also invited MPC to partner on a National Science Foundation (NSF) proposal. MPC's participation is being coordinated through the newly established Office of Advancement.

3. **Lobos Booster Club**

The Booster Club Committee is currently helping to sell advertising space in the 2017-2018 Athletics program and renewing and increasing Booster Club memberships. In addition, we are partnering with a local business that is holding a golf tournament on August 22, 2017 at the Nicklaus Club. TRIO/Upward Bound

- Over 70 local high school students from Seaside, Monterey, and Marina High participated in the Upward Bound six-week summer academic academy on the MPC campus. The academic courses in communication, math, and science focused on a theme of astronomy. The summer academy included a “project presentation day” where student displayed and presented their summer work. The program culminated with a Southern California college visit to UC Santa Barbara, USC, and Cal State Fullerton. Upward Bound will resume services to program participants this fall with weekly tutoring and Saturday academic enrichment workshops twice each month.
