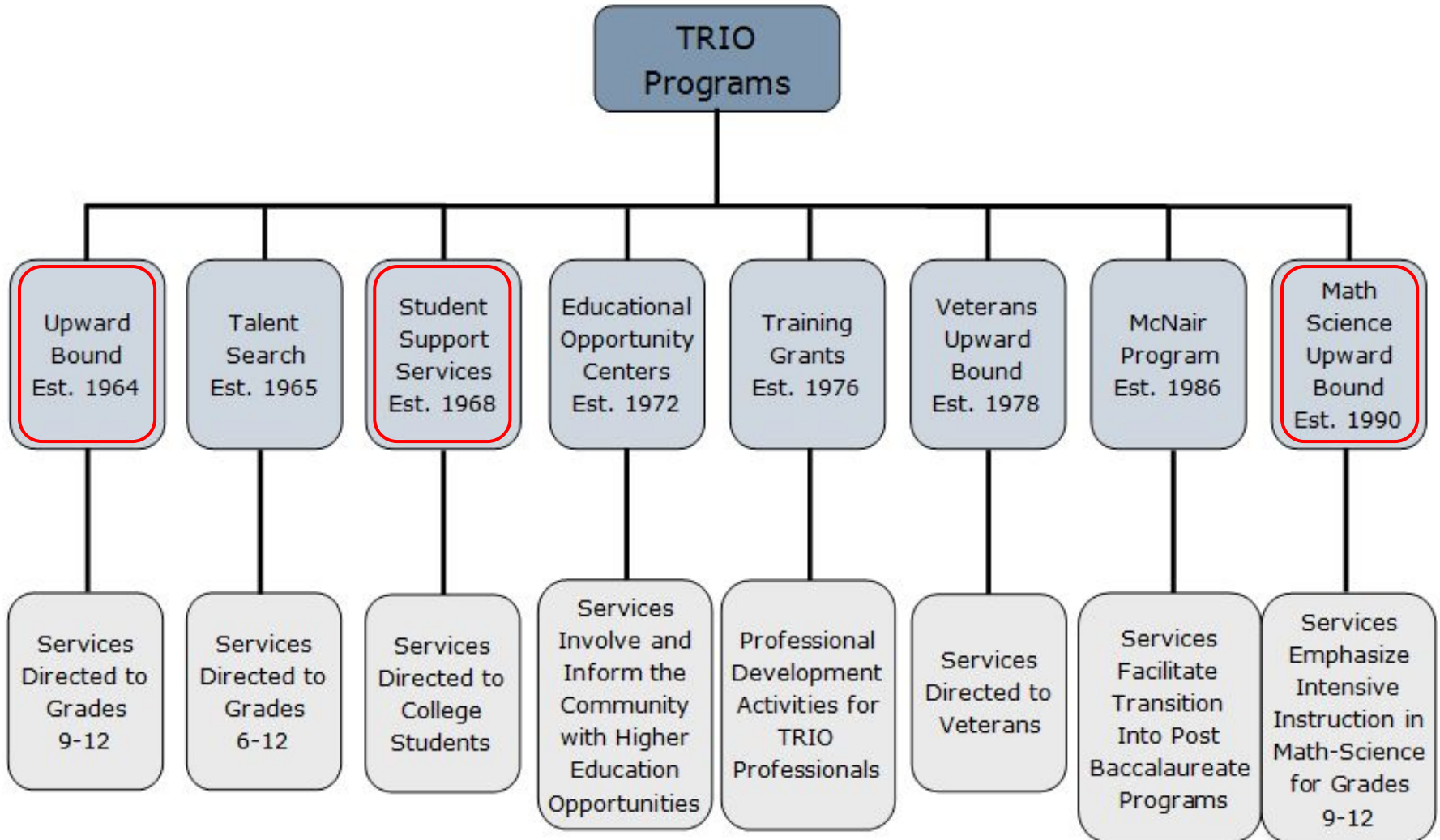




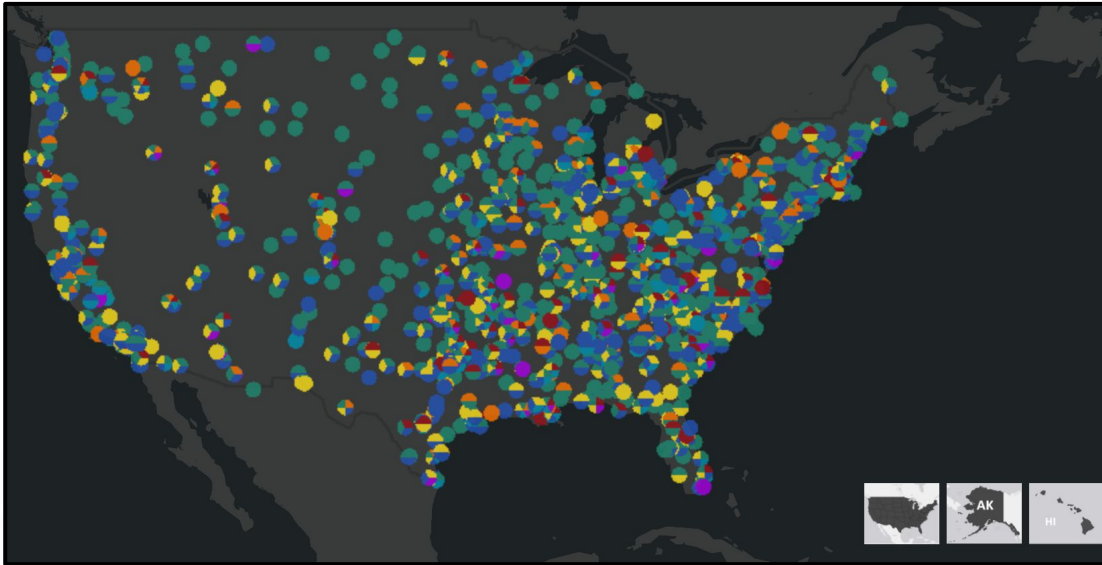

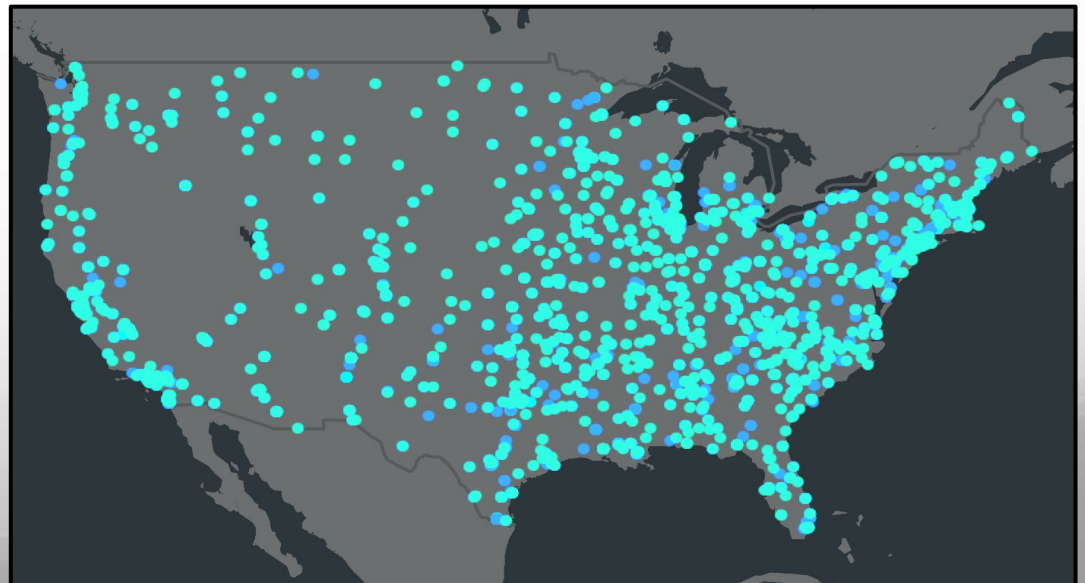

## TRIO SSS, UB, & MSUB Programs Across the Country



**MPC has a long and successful history of hosting TRIO Programs that began in 1980.  
MPC is one of the few community colleges across the nation to host three TRIO Programs.**

### **STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES (SSS)**

- First funded at MPC in 1980
- Allocated Grant Amount: \$311,357 x 5 YEARS
- Serves 200 Students
- Program Coordinator/Counselor, Grace O. Anongchanya-Calima
  - TRIO Categorical Services Coordinator, Jessica Cerritos
  - SSS Adjunct Counselor, Jasmine Do
  - SSS CSC Coordinator, Natalie Galvan

### **UPWARD BOUND (UB)**

- First funded at MPC in 1989
- Allocated Grant Amount: \$410,110 x 5 YEARS
- Funded to serve 93 students, currently serves 123
- Program Coordinator/Counselor, Sandra Washington
  - Counselor, Heather Bowers
  - TLC Site Coordinator, Marvin Crutchfield

### **MATH-SCIENCE UPWARD BOUND (MSUB)**

- First Funded at MPC 1990
- Allocated Grant Amount: \$392,422 x 5 YEARS
- Funded to serve 90 participants, currently serves 131 participants
- Program Coordinator/Counselor – Chris Calima

# TRIO

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- ❖ U.S. Citizen OR Permanent Resident (must be eligible for FAFSA)
- ❖ 2/3 of participants must be income eligible AND a first-generation college student (parent/guardian does not have a bachelor's degree)
- ❖ Remaining 1/3 of program participants may be a first-generation college student OR income eligible.
  - \*SSS programs include disability as an eligibility criteria.

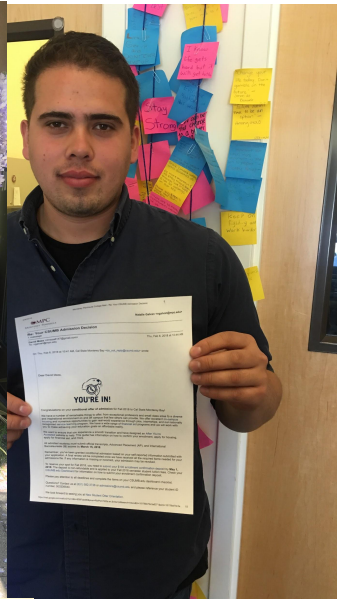
