Athletic

- MPC's fall athletic teams continue to complete as they have passed the halfway point of their seasons.
 The Lobos football team returns home for the next 2 weeks after 2 close road game losses. Their current record is 4-2.

TRiO- Math-Science and Upward Bound Programs

Over the summer the U.S. Department of Education invited TRIO Math-Science and Classic Upward Bound programs to submit proposals to receive up to \$40,000 to provide additional programs and services in (3) areas:

- Supporting student mastery of key prerequisites to ensure success in STEM fields
- Creating or expanding partnerships to give access to internships and other work-based learning experiences in STEM fields
- Increase access to STEM coursework

With the support of the MPC Foundation, who drafted the proposal, both Math-Science and Classic Upward Bound programs each were awarded \$39,960 to provide the following supplemental programs and services:

- Math modules provided by ClearFocus Test Prep to local and non-local participants, which may include online support, to support mastery in STEM field prerequisites
- Collaboration with MPC Marine Advanced Technology Education (MATE) program, which may include, but not limited to, purchasing of underwater ROV kits
- Campus visits to colleges and universities with exceptional STEM programs. These visits may include, California Technical Institute, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Georgetown, Cornell, Dartmouth, Brown, etc.

Both TRIO programs will be working together to leverage these resources to provide effective, consistent, and deliberate support and experiences to program participants to further ensure their higher education goals.

TRIO pre-college programs (UB & MSUB) had fall break activities with our students last week. On Monday we had about 43 high school juniors and seniors participate in a 4 hour SAT workshop. On Tuesday we had 53 students participate in community service at the Fort Ord National Monument and on Wednesday we took 53 students to visit UC Davis and Sacramento State where we got campus tours and had our alumni who attend the 2 schools share their experiences.

TRiO- Student Support Services

This year marks the *50th Anniversary of TRIO Student Support Services* (SSS) nationwide! In 1980, the TRIO SSS program was the first of our (3) TRIO programs at MPC. Over the past 38 years, our TRIO SSS program has supported low-income and/or first-generation college students with achieving their Associate's degree and transferring onto a four-year college/university to further achieve their Bachelor's degree.

As TRIO SSS programs celebrate across the nation, we cordially invite our family, friends, and supporters of TRIO to celebrate this momentous occasion here at MPC!
