All Election Candidacy Packets must be submitted to the ASMPC Student Activities Coordinator via email to josborne@mpc.edu on or before 12:00 pm on Friday, April 24, 2020.

The ASMPC Elections shall be held online from May 4 - May 8, 2020. Any student wishing to run for a position on the ASMPC Council must fill out this document and return it to the Student Activities Coordinator. The Student Activities Coordinator will verify all student information and the list of student signatures and ID numbers.

The following positions shall be open for candidacy through this document: *President, *Vice President, Student Trustee, Treasurer, Secretary, Director of Activities, Director of Representation, Director of Organizations, Director of Student Welfare, SSCCC (Statewide) Representative, Associate Justices (3), and Senators (10).

* Per the ASMPC Constitution, Article IX, Section C1, in order to run for the positon of President or Vice President; students must have served a minimum of one semester on ASMPC.

- → Be a student currently enrolled at MPC with a minimum of 5 units
- → The candidate must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0.
- → Be able to attend our weekly Friday meetings at 12:00 pm
- → Be able to partake in one on campus committee and one auxiliary committee
- → Be able to commit to minimum of 4 hours per week to ASMPC related tasks weekly
- → Be willing to participate in the majority of ASMPC events and activities
