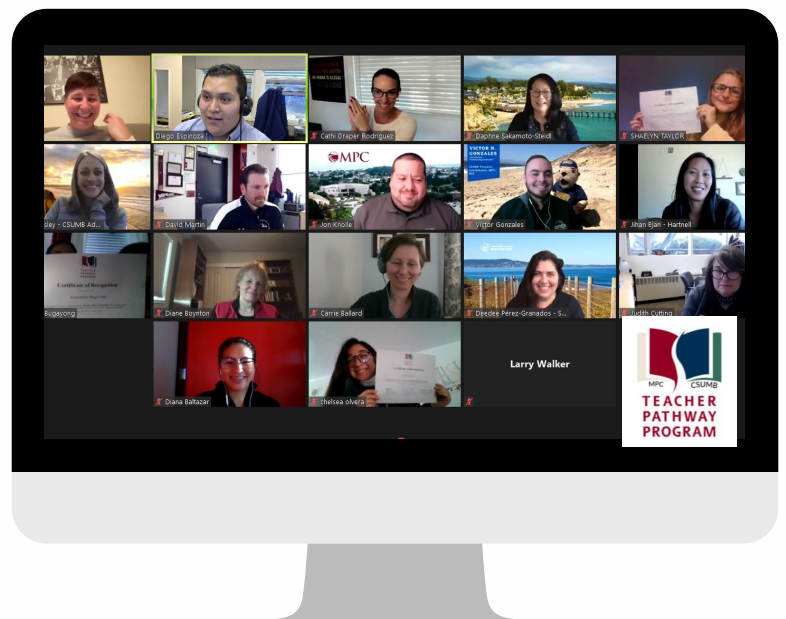

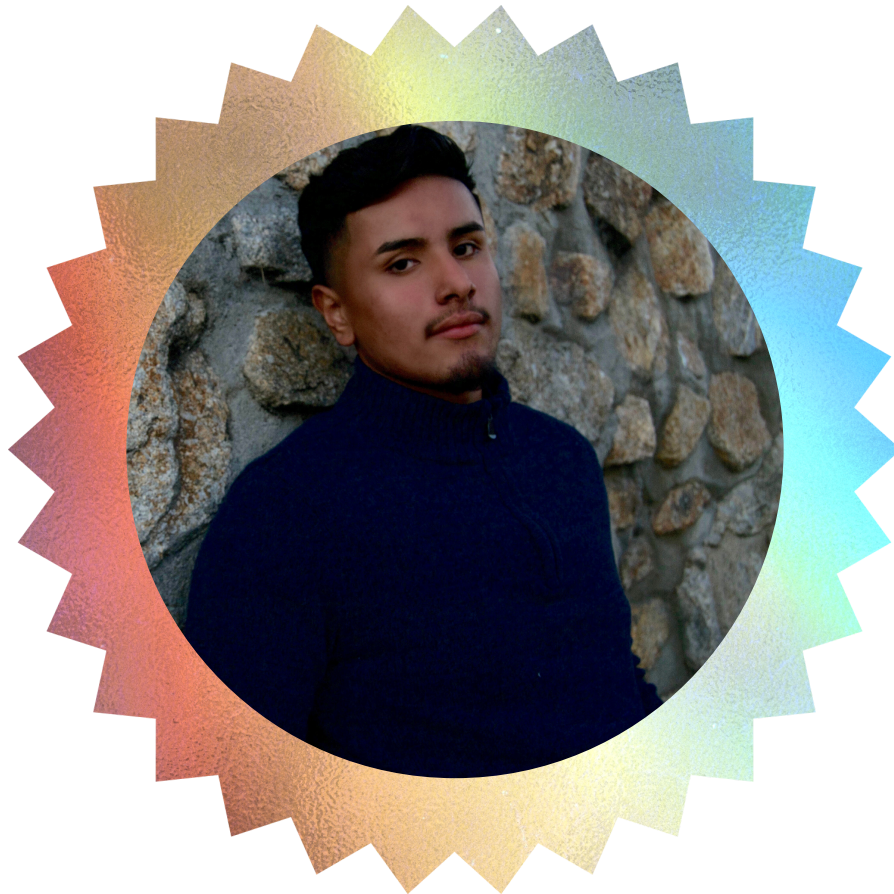

Saturday May 8th, 2021
9 AM - 4 PM

Listen to their voices and learn directly from the Chicana/o Movement activists who confronted systemic racism in schools and school boards, city councils, community colleges, county boards of supervisors, and the courts, at a full day symposium with four highly informative panel discussions.

- Panel 1: Salinas Panel**
Discussion of the history of the Voting Rights Act in the City of Salinas, including significant Chicana/o representation in important elected positions throughout the county.
- Panel 2: United Farm Workers Panel**
Hear from farm workers who struggled against great odds and won labor rights through electoral process, collective bargaining, and the establishment of union representation.
- Panel 3: The Agricultural Labor Relations Board**
Reflection on years of labor conflict in California agricultural fields, including violence that caused farmworker deaths, and led to the Agricultural Labor Relations Act, guaranteeing farmworkers the right to organize and establish union representation.
- Panel 4: First Chicanas Elected to Public Office**
Listen to Chicana elected leaders describe their groundbreaking experiences in the challenges they faced, successes they found, and their paths to victory in public office.
