The Anthropology program examines human nature and tradition, human heritage, cultures past and present, and solutions to human problems. Courses introduce students to the fields of archaeology, biological anthropology, and cultural anthropology. Through diverse course offerings, the program prepares students to satisfy general education requirements and transfer into a four-year college or university to pursue a bachelor's degree in anthropology or a related major.

## Job Outlook
