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## Instructions for filling out the Cal Grant GPA Verification Form

#### STUDENT INFORMATION SECTION.

- 1. Enter the month and year you graduated, or plan to graduate from high school.
- 2. Enter your birth date in month/day/year format.
- 3. Print your full name as it appears on your Social Security card, if you do not have a Social Security card, print your name as it appears on your Birth Certificate. Enter last name, first name, middle initial
- 4. Enter an easily accessible and secure e-mail address where you can be contacted for questions.
- 5. Enter your permanent mailing address, city, state and five-digit zip.
- 6. Enter your three-digit area code and seven-digit telephone number.
- 7. Complete questions 1 through 6, sign the form and attach a copy of the test-score report and mail by the deadline to the Commission. **DIPLOMAS WILL NOT BE PROCESSED.** The results from the ACT, SAT, GED, TASC or HiSET may be submitted in lieu of GPA if:
  - a. You participated in a home-schooling program or attended a high school that is not regionally accredited.
  - b. You attended a high school or college outside of the United States and are unable to have those grades converted to a 4.00 scale or your school did not grade in a manner that can be readily converted to a 4.00 scale (pass/fail only). \*Students who have been out of school for five years or longer can choose to submit either test scores or their GPA.
  - c.
