# Who We Are

Teach UP California offers clearly defined pathways for teacher credentialing completion for teachers with a Bachelor's degree and currently holding a Short-Term Staff Permit (STSP) or Provisional Internship Permit (PIP). We found a silver lining in the midst of this horrific pandemic. Together, we created a statewide solution and reimagined how we serve our students, specifically students in rural communities most affected by COVID-19.

In partnership with Cynthia McFarland, Grants Manager with the California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO), we proudly offer supportive services and basic needs resources to serve the entire state. In California, rural districts represent twenty-five percent of the state's student enrollment and experience the highest teacher shortages. Our project is laser-focused on increasing the number of credentialed teachers in the most rural areas of California.

We describe our programs as "No Wrong Door," meaning we can help anyone find the right "door" or pathway to credentialing completion. Additionally, we offer professional development opportunities, culturally competent coaching, credentialing exam support, and local study spaces.
