Elementary Education teachers must earn a Multiple Subject Teaching Credential, certifying educators to teach all subjects in self-contained TK-12 classrooms. The first step to becoming a certified teacher is to earn a five-year Preliminary Credential. Candidates with **at least six years** of experience can use their experience in place of completing a teacher preparation program and the student teaching component. A copy of the course descriptions must be submitted to the CTC for evaluation.
