Secondary Education teachers earn a Single Subject Teaching Credential, certifying educators to teach a specific subject in middle or high school classrooms. The first step to becoming a certified teacher is to earn a five-year Preliminary Credential. Candidates with at **least six years** of experience can use their experience in place of completing a teacher preparation program and the student teaching component. Basic Skills Requirement	Satisfied by one of the following options: CBEST Exam Multiple Subject CSET + Writing Skills CSET Pass CSU Early Assessment Program or CSU Placement Exam SAT or ACT exam AP Exam Pass Basic Skills Exam from Another State Qualifying Coursework Combination of qualifying coursework and exams
Subject Matter Competency	Satisfied by one of the following options: CSET exam Approved Subject Matter Waiver Program Completion of an academic major in the subject area of the credential Combination of qualified coursework and exam
US Constitution Competency	Satisfied by one of the following options: Complete a course on the U.S. Constitution Pass an examination by an accredited college or university
Developing English Language Skills Course	Candidates must complete a course in Developing English Language Skills. CTC identifies that the course must "include Reading, that is research-based and includes the study of phonemic awareness, spelling patterns, early intervention techniques, ongoing diagnostic techniques, and strong literature, language, and comprehension components." A copy of the course descriptions must be submitted to the CTC for evaluation.
Computer Education	 Satisfied by <u>one</u> of the following options: Complete foundational computer education coursework. Pass the Preliminary Education Technology test.

Teaching Performance Assessment	Satisfied by <u>one</u> of the following options (completed while in a Teacher Preparation Program): CaITPA edTPA
Rigorous Performance Evaluations	Candidates must submit original evaluations of performance evaluations in at least two years of teaching. Candidates must have received a rating of satisfactory or better. For more information about what the evaluations must entail, please visit the CTC Website.
Formal Recommendation	Upon completion of the credential program and the requirements listed above, candidates will apply to the CTC for their Preliminary Credential.
