Special Education teachers earn an Education Specialist Teaching Credential, certifying educators to teach students in specific areas of specializations such as Mild to Moderate Support Needs, Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Visually Impaired, and more. The first step to becoming a certified teacher is to earn a five-year Preliminary Credential. One of the most common pathways to earn a Preliminary Credential is the College or University route. Below is a sequence of the requirements and a short description of how to fulfill the requirements.
