

## **College or University Route Checklist**

Special Education teachers earn an Education Specialist Teaching Credential, certifying educators to teach students in specific areas of specializations such as Mild to Moderate Support Needs, Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Visually Impaired, and more. The first step to becoming a certified teacher is to earn a five-year Preliminary Credential. Individuals who have extensive classroom experience might consider the College or University Internship Route. This route allows candidates who have satisfied the minimum 120-hour intern preservice preparation and have enrolled in a Commission on Teaching Credentialing (CTC)-approved credential program at a public or private college or university to serve as a teacher under the supervision of a credential program and employer (K-12 district).
