This ambassador position and opportunity will provide support to the baseball field and baseball stadium before and after class and competition for the baseball program and athletic department.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Set up and removal of day to day practice equipment
- Baseball facility repairs (painting, artificial turf repairs, weed removal, garbage removal, batting cage repairs, building of new equipment and training tools)
- Meet with instructor and coaches to report needed repairs.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for this position, one must possess knowledge of baseball and baseball equipment. A student ambassador at the baseball stadium must be dependable, complete tasks, and have a flexible schedule before and after classes and competition at the baseball stadium

Minimum Requirements

- Must apply for Federal Financial Aid and be eligible for Federal Work-Study
- Be a currently enrolled student at MPC



- Be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units for Fall/Spring term or a minimum of 3 units for the Summer term
- Maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA
- Must be a student in good standing and not on Academic, Progress, or Disciplinary Probation
- Must have an updated Education plan on file at all times

Desirable Qualifications

- Ability to work 6 20 hours a week.
- Ability to use rakes, repairs with wrenches, paint, and lift heavy equipment
